- Most medical students, trainees, and practitioners are not prepared to treat people with IDD.
- Eight out of ten graduating medical students receive no IDD-specific education or training.
- For the 10-16 million people with IDD, this lack of training causes gaps in services, high rates of preventable conditions, and reduced life expectancy.

- ABC3 is an action collaborative aiming to scale strategies for engaging, preparing, and supporting clinicians to provide better care for people with IDD.
